Dear Ms. Hudson,

I am writing in regards to the email that the Board received from R.J. Potter concerning the construction of the access road for the wind turbines. As R.J. reported and has shown with photos, the petitioner has started construction without full approval of all conditions. This has evidently been going on for a couple of weeks. On December 5th a friend of mine who lives in Fairfax asked me what was going on on Georgia Mountain, as she had heard heavy construction noises and blasting all week. Dan FitzGerald got a call from a woman on the other side of Lake Arrowhead around the same time who had heard explosions coming from the mountain and wanted to know what was happening. My neighbor here on Georgia Mountain Road said that on December 7th he heard a large explosion coming from the mountain. As indicated by R.J. Potter yesterday, neighbors on Ted Road

have reported to him that they have seen scores of heavy equipment including graders, skidders, tandem trucks with road material, tractor trailers and logging trucks go up that side of the mountain for days. They have heard explosions as well. The access road is being cleared and improved.

The petitioner has three separate projects going on on the mountain: Logging and chipping, the sugarhouse and the wind project. Because they are intertwined, it has been difficult to prove what work is for which project. But this work is clearly not being done for the sugarhouse, which is on the other side of the mountain. If the petitioner is going to maintain that he is doing this amount of work for logging, he will be once again pulling the wool over the board member's eyes. Or is he just going to admit that he is playing the game of "Commit the crime, pay the fine" as other wind developers in Vermont have done?

I implore the board to act on this immediately, requiring the petitioner to stop all construction on all projects on the mountain while it investigates this issue.
